Laetitia Rispel, Professor of Public Health, University of the Witwatersrand

Laetitia Rispel is a professor of Public Health at the University of the Witwatersrand, Johannesburg, South Africa, where she holds a Research Chair on the Health Workforce as part of the South African Research Chairs Initiative (SARChI). She is an NRF rated researcher, whose research interests are in human resources for health and the performance of the healthcare system. Professor Rispel has won several national and international awards, including a prestigious Senior Africa Oxford Fellowship in acknowledgement of her wide-ranging research, teaching, and leadership expertise. She was president of the World Federation of Public Health Associations from 2018 to 2020, the first woman from Africa and the third in the history of the organisation to achieve this honour. Professor Rispel is a member of the WHO Expert Advisory Group for the third review of the WHO Global Code of Practice on the International Recruitment of Health Personnel.
